# MANDATED REPORTER POLICY AND PROCEDURE

The Roman Catholic Bishop of Springfield, a Corporation Sole ("Diocese of Springfield") recognizes that the protection of children is a responsibility shared by the entire community, including the Church, parents, teachers, healthcare professionals, public safety officials, public and private social services agencies and the general public.

The Diocese of Springfield is committed to working with civil authorities to protect children by preventing child abuse and neglect, reporting alleged incidents of abuse or neglect, cooperating in investigations of allegations and any resultant judicial proceedings, as well as advising victims of their right to report independently and supporting their exercise of that right, as specified in the *Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People*.

The Diocese will act in accordance with standards that will, at all times, comply with those established in civil law, and this policy shall be reviewed periodically by the Office of Safe Environment and Victim Assistance (OSEVA) to ensure complete compliance with current civil law.

#### I. DEFINITIONS:

- A. **Mandated Reporter** (As defined by Massachusetts law): The Commonwealth of Massachusetts includes the following in their list of mandated reporters:
  - a. "Clergy members, including ordained or licensed leaders of any church or religious body, persons performing official duties on behalf of a church or religious body, or persons employed by a religious body to supervise, educate, coach, train, or counsel a child on a regular basis." <a href="https://www.mass.gov/doc/dcf-mandated-reporter-guide/download">https://www.mass.gov/doc/dcf-mandated-reporter-guide/download</a>
  - b. The sole exception is that ordained priests shall not report any information subject to the priest-penitent privilege.
- B. **Diocesan Personnel:** Clergy, staff, volunteers and other adults including those who do not work with or volunteer with children.

- C. **Child**: "Children," "child," "minor," "youth," or "young person" is defined to mean any person fewer than 18 years of age.
- D. **Vulnerable Adults:** A person who is known or believed to be under the age of 18 years (i.e. "a child"), or a person:
  - a. Between the ages of 18 and 59 inclusive who is a disabled person as that term is presently defined in Massachusetts General Law Chapter 19C, § 1 (i.e. "a disabled person"); or
  - b. A person who is 60 years of age or older (i.e. "an elderly person").
  - c. For purposes of mandated reporting policy, young adults who are of legal age but remain in the care of our parishes and school are to be considered "vulnerable adults."
  - d. "Vulnerable persons" are sometimes referred to as "special victims" in the law enforcement community.
- E. **Reasonable Suspicion**: Reasonable suspicion has been defined by the U.S. Supreme Court as "the sort of common-sense conclusion about human behavior upon which practical people . . . are entitled to rely." Further, it has defined reasonable suspicion as requiring only something more than an "unarticulated hunch." It requires facts or circumstances that give rise to more than a bare, imaginary, or purely conjectural suspicion. https://definitions.uslegal.com/r/reasonable-suspicion

## II. REPORTING POLICY AND PROCEDURE

- A. **Diocesan Standard for Reporting**: Any Diocesan personnel, including those who do not work with or volunteer with children, who has a reasonable suspicion or reasonable cause to believe that a child is being or has been the victim of physical abuse, sexual abuse, sexual assault, or neglect, shall make a report to the appropriate civil and Diocesan authorities as set forth at II.C. Any Diocesan personnel with knowledge of or reasonable cause to believe that an adult is the victim of historical sexual abuse or that a vulnerable adult is the victim or physical abuse, sexual abuse, sexual assault, or neglect shall make a report as set forth in II. E. below.
  - a. Diocesan personnel are required to report suspected incidents of current child abuse to the Department of Children and Families (DCF) both by phone and in writing.
  - b. Historical incidents of sexual abuse alleged to have occurred with the victim was a minor, even if the victim is now an adult shall be reported by phone or email and in writing to the OSEVA. (See II.E. below)
  - c. Diocesan personnel are expected to report suspected incidents of abuse of vulnerable adults by phone, email, and in writing to the OSEVA. (See II.E. below)

- B. Incidents to be reported based on reasonable cause to believe that a child is suffering emotional or physical injury resulting from:
  - a. Abuse inflicted on the child that causes harm to the child's welfare or health, including sexual abuse;
  - b. Neglect, including malnutrition;
  - c. Physical dependence on an addictive drug at birth; or
  - d. Being sexually exploited;
  - e. Being a victim of human trafficking as defined under MGL c. 119 §51A.
- C. Mandated Reporters with a reasonable suspicion or reasonable cause to believe that a child is being or has been abused shall immediately report these suspicions by phone to your local DCF Area office or the Massachusetts State Hotline at 800.792.5200. If a reporter suspects that a child is in immediate danger, call 911 to report.
  - a. Immediately after reporting to DCF, report to the Diocesan OSEVA by phone at 800.842.9055
  - b. WITHIN 48 HOURS: Complete and file a written 51A by fax or email: <a href="https://www.mass.gov/doc/child-abuse-reporting-form/download">https://www.mass.gov/doc/child-abuse-reporting-form/download</a> with Mass DCF (see Appendix A) with copy to the OSEVA (Instructions for where to file are on the form).
- D. Reports of suspected current or ongoing abuses of a minor shall include the following information to the extent it is known:
  - a. Name, address, and age of the child;
  - b. Name and address of the child's parent, guardian, or caregiver;
  - c. Whereabouts of the child;
  - d. Nature and extent of the alleged maltreatment and any history of injury that may be evidence of past abuse;
  - e. Name, address, and whereabouts of the person or persons suspected of perpetrating the abuse or neglect, if known; and
  - f. Any other information that may be relevant to determine the cause of the suspected abuse or the identity of the person responsible.

(N.B. The Reporter's responsibility is to report reasonable cause to suspect or believe that a child is being or has been abused. The Reporter should not conduct any further investigation in order to obtain more information than is readily available. It is the responsibility of the civil authority to ascertain whether an investigation is warranted and to conduct any investigation.)

- E. Reports of Historical Abuse or suspected abuse of a vulnerable person by Diocesan Personnel shall be reported immediately to the OSEVA by phone at 800.842.9055.
  - a. WITHIN 48 HOURS: Complete and file a Historical Abuse Report Form (see Appendix B) with OSEVA by fax to 413.452.0678 or email to <a href="mailto:reportabuse@diospringfield.org">reportabuse@diospringfield.org</a>.
  - b. Reports to local District Attorneys will be filed by the OSEVA within 24 hours of receipt of the Historical Abuse Report Form.

- c. Adult alleged victims of abuse by Diocesan Personnel shall be informed of their independent right to report to the appropriate civil authorities. Diocesan Personnel shall support victims in their exercise of this right.
- d. OSEVA shall report of abuse of a vulnerable adult by phone and in writing to the appropriate state authority within 24 hours.
- F. Incidents to be reported based on a reasonable suspicion or reasonable cause to believe that a vulnerable adults is suffering from physical abuse, sexual abuse, or neglect include:
  - a. Abuse inflicted on the vulnerable adult that causes harm to the vulnerable adult's welfare or health, including sexual abuse; and
  - b. Neglect, including malnutrition.
- G. Diocesan Personnel submitting reports shall makes themselves available and fully cooperate in any investigation of child abuse/neglect. This includes investigations of alleged sexual abuse of minors who are now adults.
- H. Massachusetts law provides civil and criminal immunity to any mandated reporter who acts in good faith and not frivolously or with deliberate intent to do harm to another. Immunity extends to investigations and judicial proceedings that arise from report.
- I. The Bishop or his designee will provide a verbal and written report of suspected child abuse to the provincial of an accused religious or the bishop of a diocesan priest who is not a priest of the Diocese of Springfield, Massachusetts.
- J. Record Keeping: Accurate records of reports received, whether supported or not, and all actions taken, including evidence, church authority's response to the reports and relevant comments as well as notifications by the OSEVA or other representative of the Diocese to officials of the State and/or local authorities or provincials shall be kept in strict, secure, and confidential files.
  - a. Copies of original statements provided to DCF and law enforcement will be kept on file.
  - b. For the protection of both the individuals involved and the institutions, records shall be kept indefinitely.
- K. In cases in which the individual designated to receive the report is the accused, the report should be directed to the Bishop or his designee.

## Report of Child(ren) Alleged to be Suffering from Abuse or Neglect

Massachusetts law requires mandated reporters to immediately make a report to the Department of Children and Families (DCF) when they have reasonable cause to believe that a child under the age of 18 years is suffering from abuse and/or neglect by:



STEP 1: Immediately reporting by oral communication to the local DCF Area Office (see contact information at end of form); and

STEP 2: Completing and sending this written report to the local DCF Area Office within 48 hours of making the oral report.

# Report of Historical Allegation of Sexual Abuse

The Roman Catholic Diocese of Springfield requires clergy, staff, educators and volunteers to immediately make a report to the diocesan Office of Safe Environment and Victim Assistance (OSEVA) when they have information that a person who is now over the age of 18 suffered sexual abuse when they were a child under the age of 18 years.

- Step 1: Immediately report to Diocesan OSEVA at 800.842.9055 or 413.452.0624.
- Step 2: Diocesan OSEVA report to local district attorney
